

Often times cat owners have reached a loss as to why their cat does not use their litter box. Here are some good methods that will help you solve the issue. The cat litter box will be the very first thing you should check always. It ought to be in a quiet, individual part of the house. Many people put them inside their basements and keep the door open a little as this not only creates a personal environment but also keeps odors to a minimum in the rest of the house. Some utilize a closet but if you do that be certain and keep the field clear to dont forget to keep the door open and reduce odors in that limited space! Yet another placement possibility is under a dining table. Lots of people look for a place without carpeting is better from the maintenance perspective as tile or cement is a lot more straightforward to clean. Consider in the event that you changed the litter box in any way: \* Has the box been moved to a top traffic area recently? \* Does the-box need cleaning? \* Is really a new kitten being used or are there fat an odor (clumping and unscented is most beneficial). \* Gets the range of the litter in the-box changed? Some cats like their kitten deeply, the others shallow. \* Your pet has outgrown the-box and needs a bigger one. \* The-box is too hard to enter and leave. This can be a concern for older cats. Don't put food and water nearby the cat litter box. Cats like both of these parts kept separate (dont you?). If your cat has selected a certain room to land try closing the-door to that room if it is possible to or address the target area with furniture. Put a plate of food over the target area as cats want to keep their eating area far from their bath-room. Take your pet to the Vet on a regular basis. When you have more than one cat get each one of these their own litter box. Maybe you have recently moved? A cat may smell a place where the last owners cat urinated. Allow cat alone so it may have some privacy while it goes. If it is a new pet in your house it might take from three to ten weeks to get adjusted to the new environment. Have patience! Was there a current addition or loss to the family? A brand new baby, partner? This is usually temporary before the cat sets for the change in their environment. An alteration in your schedule may put off your cat's schedule as well and cause issues. Try and phase in significant changes in lifestyle gradually. NEVER punish the cat by kicking, striking, chasing, screaming or rubbing their nose within their urine (remember the smell doesnt bother them). Cats can not make the cause and effect connection like we could so punishment following the simple truth is useless and will simply make things worse. Cats are normally very clean animals and they know where they're going. It is important to remember this and take to and help your pet over come any stress or anxiety they could be having in a patient and supportive way.
